



























Neighbourhood Timeline

1960 aprox. 




One of the residents built their house in the neighborhood with a verbal and informal permit, but only if it was built like a shed - "casa abarracada"




Young resident: when people from outside referred to S. João de Brito as a shantytown she started asserting: "Yes, I live in a shed. Mine is the yellow one."
